

International students

Erasmus+ is the EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport in Europe in all sectors of lifelong learning (school education, higher education, further education, youth activities, etc.).

Studying abroad is a central part of Erasmus+ and has been shown to have a positive effect on later job prospects. It is also a chance to improve language skills, gain self-confidence and independence and immerse yourself in a new culture.

The goals of mobility are:

- improving learning competencies,
- increasing employability and employment opportunities,
- increase initiative and entrepreneurship
- increase self-confidence and self-esteem,
- improving language skills,
- increasing intercultural awareness,
- more active participation in society,
- better knowledge of EU projects and EU values,
- increasing motivation for further education (formal and non-formal) and post-mobility training.

Types of Student mobility are:

- for STUDY and
- TRAINEESHIP.

Students can also do a blended mobility, combining a virtual period with a physical short or long-term mobility.

Access to Erasmus+ Online Linguistic Support will help you learn the language used for your studies if you are moving between Programme countries.

Conditions

To study abroad with Erasmus+, you must be registered in a higher education institution and enrolled in studies leading to a recognised degree or tertiary-level qualification.

Your period of study abroad must be relevant for your degree-related learning and personal development needs, and be part of the study programme that you are following.

Your home institution and the receiving institution must have an inter-institutional agreement between them for you to study there with Erasmus+.

Both institutions must also hold the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (if they are in Programme countries). Institutions from Partner countries commit to the principles of the Charter when signing the inter-institutional agreements.

How to apply

Students submit their application for mobility at the international or Erasmus+ office of their higher education institution.
